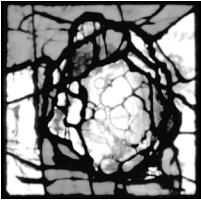

Blast from the Past(or)

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Corpus Christi

June 18, 2017

For me, one of the most compelling and beautiful (and emotional) modern explanations of the Eucharist comes in the form of a short film called, *God in the Streets of New York City*. *Grassroots Films* of Brooklyn, NY, depicts the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal carrying Jesus in the Eucharist through the chaotic streets of Manhattan. It's only 5 minutes long (score!) but in that time, some tears come and I am again enkindled with what it means to be Catholic in the Power of the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith. The film also reminds me why in the heck I became a priest in the first place, clarifying a desire finding its direction amidst the myriad daily tasks, conflicts, complaints, critiques, joys and sorrows. It's all there. Catholics rightly hold the most tender and fundamental devotion for the Body and Blood of Christ. In the Real Presence of Jesus, we're reminded that to be the Body of Christ, we have to consume the Body of Christ. Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist is a gift and mystery: a reminder, once again, that ***the bread I give you is my flesh for the life of the world***. Yup. God loves you that much. Contemplating the Eucharist, any thinking person would have to catch her breath. On this Fathers Day, we realize that it is Our Father Who is the gift giver. It's not we who first give dad a necktie or juicer (I blew it that year), it is Our Father Who first gives us His Son. That's really Fathers Day; the self-emptying of God. That is the Eucharist, for our consumption, contemplation and companionship for the journey. This is Jesus in the Flesh. Thanks be to God. ***Sweet Sacrament, we thee adore, oh make us love thee more and more.....*** May we Catholics again be amazed at the Mass.
