Blast from the Past(or)

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 16, 2017

Why do you speak to them in parables?' Such was the burning question posed to Jesus by His disciples following His story about the sower and the seed. The disciples wanted more information. Perhaps they felt the people were left hanging. In addition to healing, forgiving and revealing Himself as the Incarnate Son of God, Jesus as teacher often utilized the pedagogical method of parables to foster His followers to further reflection and deeper discipleship. But sometimes, like the disciples, we desire the bottom line over a story. Unsatisfactory explanations can be frustrating when we desire more information. Don't leave me hanging. I can remember going on a 'man' golf trip years ago (he-men only) and was disappointed to find that the airline lost my clubs. The airline concierge-lady explained that 'something happened. Uh, I kind of gathered that, but I desired more information. I was left hanging. Once, as a young kid addicted to pro-wrestling, my dad did not allow me to stay up to watch the much-anticipated Bob Backlund/Jimmy Super-Fly Snuka steel cage match live from Madison Square Garden (pro-wrestling is real, by the way, and don't let anyone tell you differently) because it started very late and it was a school night. I was outraged. Why?!? This was an injustice. Tyrants like dad must fall. Dad simply stated, 'you're going to bed now or you will really have something to be upset about.' I did not find his explanation satisfactory. I wanted more information. I was left hanging. The woman from the citizener my dad might not enough in parables, but often in life we feel. the airline or my dad might not speak in parables, but often in life we feel less than satisfied with what we're being told and too frustrated to take time to probe deeper and contemplate more. Yet parables show us that We live forward but learn backward, wrote Kierkegaard (I like to say Kierkegaard at parties. If only I were smoking a pipe when I say his name, to give the aura of deep reflection). Life does not always give us the 'bottom line,' especially in the plans of God. But in God Who is Love, we are never left hanging, despite our impatience. He has given us all that is necessary for salvation. Don't think, look, as someone wise said. Then you will realize, blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen I say to you many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it......


